#### What We're Seeing

#### Monthly growth:

New York City's private sector added 30,500 jobs in July 2022. Private sector jobs have now grown by 134,800 since December 2021.

#### · Year-over-year growth:

Private sector jobs have seen strong growth of 8.1% year-over-year, faster than the national growth rate of 4.5%. In contrast, government jobs have only increased 0.6% since July 2021.

#### · Labor force:

The city's unemployment rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 6.1% in July. The labor force participation rate increased 0.2 percentage points to 60.4%, the highest rate since March 2020.

#### · Jobs recovery:

The city has now regained 795,300 (84.0%) of the 946,900 private sector jobs lost between February 2020 and April 2020. The city currently has 3,956,700 private sector jobs.

#### · Sector recovery:

Accommodation and Food Services has 58,200 fewer jobs than it did in February 2020, while the Retail sector has 38,800 fewer. The Information Services sector has seen the strongest recovery and has regained 47,900 jobs since the sector's employment trough in July 2020 (134.7% of jobs that were lost).
