#### What We're Seeing

#### Monthly growth:

New York City's private sector added 13,800 jobs in May 2022. Private sector jobs have now grown by 85,000 since December 2021.

#### · Year-over-year growth:

While private sector jobs have seen strong growth of 8.4% year-over-year, faster than the national growth rate of 5.0%, government jobs have only increased 1.6% since May 2021.

#### · Labor force:

The city's unemployment rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 6.2% in May, still markedly higher than the pre-pandemic rate of 3.7%. The labor force participation rate increased 0.5 percentage points to 59.9%, but is still down from the pandemic-era high of 60.0% in June 2021.

#### · Jobs recovery:

The city has now regained 745,500 (78.7%) of the 946,900 private sector jobs lost between February 2020 and April 2020. The city currently has 3,906,900 private sector jobs.

#### · Sector recovery:

Accommodation and Food Services has 65,100 fewer jobs than it did in February 2020, while the Retail sector has 39,200 fewer. The Information Services sector has seen the strongest recovery and has regained 44,200 jobs since the sector's employment trough in July 2020 (124.2% of jobs that were lost).
