NOTES

1 Operating data is reported based on EDC's audited financial statements and general ledger; City Capital expense data is reported based on the City's Financial Management System.

2 Fuel costs are reported net of the related fuel hedging program that is designed to stabilize budgeted fuel costs.

- 3 "NYC Ferry Department Personnel Costs" reflect the Ferry department at EDC and staff directly involved in supporting NYC Ferry operations, infrastructure construction, maintenance and security and includes fringe benefit costs. Beginning with this FY22 update, this reports adds a separate line titled "EDC Other Personnel Costs" that additionally includes costs of EDC personnel who are not as directly involved in NYC Ferry administration but who contribute partial time to NYC Ferry, including overhead and other program support activities. These figures are based on an estimate of staff time dedicated to NYC Ferry. - Personnel Costs for the period from FY18 to FY21. Those costs were excluded from the previous Supplemental Financial Information release.
- 4 In FY22, EDC was granted \$15M in CTL and \$30M in COVID-19 federal relief funds. Prior to FY22, EDC had not previously been granted CTL or federal funds.
- 5 The FY22 "Ferry Surplus before EDC Cash Reserve" of \$42.5M offsets prior year deficits.
- 6 Subsidy per Ferry Rider is calculated as the Total Ferry Operating Deficit divided by Ferry Ridership. The reported Subsidy per Ferry Rider for FY18 to FY21 increased in this release, reflecting the additional "EDC Other Personnel Costs" now estimated for those years.
- 7 FY18 was the first full year of NYC Ferry service; NYC Ferry launched May 1, 2017. Capital expenses prior to FY18 total \$45.9M; Operating expenses directly connected with NYC Ferry totaled \$18.9M; net Operating expenses connected with the former operation (East River Ferry) totaled \$12.2M.

8 Cost reductions in FY21 reflect temporary but major service changes due to the NY PAUSE/COVID-19.

9 Reconciling Non-Operating Expenses are reported annually for completeness to the reader, but are not included in the Subsidy per Ferry Rider, consistent with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) standards. NYC Ferry vessels are owned by EDC; vessel depreciation is reported based on EDC audited financial statements. Depreciation of Ferry Landings, Homeport and Other Miscellaneous assets that are owned by the City of New York are not included in this report.

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
