

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE OF NEW YORK CITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION July 20, 2023

A special meeting of the Governance Committee (the "Committee") of the Board of Directors of New York City Economic Development Corporation ("NYCEDC"), called at the direction of the President of NYCEDC, was held, pursuant to notice by an Assistant Secretary, on Thursday, July 20, 2023, in Conference Room 13-11, at the offices of NYCEDC at One Liberty Plaza, New York, New York.

The following members of the Committee were present:

Members of NYCEDC staff also were present.

The meeting was chaired by Mr. McSpiritt, Chairperson of the Committee, and called to order at 1:09 p.m. Mark Silversmith, a Special Counsel and Assistant Secretary of NYCEDC, served as secretary of the duly constituted meeting, at which a quorum was present.

1. <u>Approval of the Minutes of the October 21, 2022 Special Meeting of the</u> <u>Governance Committee</u>

There were no questions or comments with respect to the minutes of the October 21, 2022 special meeting of the Governance Committee, as submitted. A motion to approve such minutes, as submitted, was made, seconded and adopted. Mr. Friedman abstained from voting on this item.

2. FY2023 Board Self-Evaluation Survey

Pursuant to the Public Authorities Accountability Act of 2005 as amended, the Governance Committee of NYCEDC is required to annually perform a self-evaluation of the Board of Directors (the "Board") of NYCEDC. The Governance Committee reviewed the questions attached hereto as Attachment A to Exhibit A for the self-evaluation of the Board of NYCEDC, which are similar to those recommended to be used in the self-evaluation by the New York State Authorities Budget Office, and determined that they are appropriate for use for the self-evaluation of NYCEDC's Board in 2023. Furthermore, the Governance Committee approved of using Survey Monkey to conduct the 2023 self-evaluation survey.

Mr. Silversmith noted that the survey would be performed anonymously, that the survey questions for 2023 were the same as those used in prior years and that Directors could provide comments with their responses. At this time, Mr. McSpiritt explained that once the survey results were received, the Governance Committee would meet again to review the results and any comments provided, and that at a subsequent meeting of the Board of Directors Mr. McSpiritt would provide a report summarizing the results and comments from the survey. Mr. Floyd pointed out that it was important that the survey guestions had remained consistent over the years because it enabled the Committee to track and discuss trends. Mr. McSpiritt stated that he agreed with Mr. Floyd and that it was important to keep the survey questions consistent in order to see trends.

A motion was then made to adopt the resolution set forth in Exhibit A hereto. Such motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

2. Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the meeting, pursuant to a motion made, seconded and unanimously approved the meeting of the Governance Committee was adjourned.
