A. Project Description:

McDonald BESS, LLC is a Delaware limited liability company (the "Company"). The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Soltage NY DevCo, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, and an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of Soltage, LLC ("Soltage"). Soltage is a private, independent power producer that develops solar energy generation facilities and energy storage projects. Soltage's majority owner is Igneo Infrastructure Partners, a global infrastructure investment firm. The Company is seeking financial assistance in connection with the construction and equipping of a battery energy storage system with an estimated storage capacity of 5 Megawatts ("MW"). The battery storage system consists of six Tesla Megapack storage systems, concrete pads for equipment, including transformers, switchboards, and metering capable of providing 20 MW hours of energy storage capacity total per day. The battery energy storage system will total 2,200 square feet and will be located on a 6,350 square foot parcel of land at 2481 McDonald Avenue Brooklyn, New York (the "Facility"). The land will be leased by the Company who will operate the battery energy storage system capable of charging from and discharging into the New York power grid.

Soltage is a leader in the development, financing, and operation of distributed utility-scale solar and storage assets for utility, commercial, industrial, and municipal customers across the United States. Founded in 2005 in Jersey City, NJ, Soltage has developed more than 125 clean energy projects with more than 500MW total distributed generating capacity under construction and management in 16 states across the US. Our storage division was founded in 2019 and has a pipeline of over 100 MW of stand-alone energy storage and solar-plus-storage projects. In September of 2023, Igneo Infrastructure Partners, a global infrastructure investment manager with approximately \$18 billion in assets under management, acquired a majority equity interest in Soltage.

E. PROPOSED PROJECT ACTIVITIES

McDonald BESS, LLC is a subsidiary of Soltage NY DevCo, LLC, a subsidiary fully owned by Soltage, LLC. Soltage is a developer and owner of solar energy and battery assets across the US. McDonald BESS, LLC is seeking financial assistance in connection with the battery energy storage project occupying a 6,350 square feet parcel located at 2481 McDonald Avenue, Brooklyn, NY, 11223. The facility will be owned by McDonald BESS, LLC and used to charge energy from the grid and discharge to the grid based on ConEdison's peak and off-peak demand windows. The battery will be a 5 MW / 20 MWh battery and will take up ~2,200 square feet of the site including all of the supporting electrical equipment needed. The total project cost is anticipated to be approximately \$15 M. The anticipated closing date is April 2024. The project is anticipated to begin construction in August 2024 and be operational by May 2025. Our plans for the project and capital investment require supplemental support from NYCIDA due to the complex nature of introducing grid-scale storage into the embedded urban environment. Should this project not receive the supplemental support it requires, there are mechanisms in place to halt the development of the project, including terminating the property lease option and discontinuing negotiations with the battery supplier and Engineering and Construction partner. Soltage is not yet legally bound to lease the property until exercising the Lease Option, and may terminate the Lease Option at any time with a 30-day notice period to the Landlord (See 3.2 Option Payment on page 1 of attached lease option). The Soltage storage team has had several informal reviews with both the specialized FDNY storage team and DOB's Office of Technical Certification and Research (OCTR), and we have received preliminary positive feedback on this project. The formal permitting of this project is being initiated on pace with plans. Con Ed's Coordinated Electric System Interconnection Review has been completed and Soltage has paid the inte
