


Project Location

- 2460 2nd Avenue in East Harlem (MN Block 1803, Lot 1)
 - City-owned, full-block site
 - Occupied by decommissioned MTA bus depot; MTA has transferred ownership to EDC
- A portion of the site is the historic Harlem African Burial Ground (HABG)







History

The Harlem African Burial Ground dates to Harlem's earliest days


- 1660: Nieuw Haarlem is chartered by the Dutch on indigenous land with Low Dutch Reformed Church as founding church.
- 1869: Prompted by northward expansion of the city, church leaders begin transferring human remains of white Europeans to new plots. Those buried in the HABG are left behind.

Several uses occupied the site of the Harlem African Burial Ground

- 1885-1917: Beer garden and casino
- 1917-1918: 15th New York National Guard Infantry Regiment barracks
- 1918-1945: Movie studios


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- 1945-1962: Third Avenue Railway Company trolley barn; Current depot built in 1947
- 1962-2015: MTA/NYCT 126th St bus depot



Project Overview

- In 2009, The Harlem African Burial Ground Task Force (HABGTF) is founded to advocate for a memorial. The successor of this group is the Harlem African Burial Ground Initiative (HABGI)
- 2015: MTA decommissions bus depot and vacates site
- 2015–2016: NYCEDC is asked to lead the redevelopment project and commissions a first-phase archaeological investigation, which uncovers over 140 human remains on the site
- 2017: CB11, Manhattan Borough President, City Planning Commission, and City Council approve land use actions
- Rezoning ULURP approved Sept. 2017 for outdoor memorial, indoor cultural education center, housing (≥524K SF; 80% affordable), and retail/commercial, memorialized in POA;
 - Process included \$30M in HIF funding for archaeology, memorial and cultural center





Harlem African Burial Ground Initiative

- The Harlem African Burial Ground Task Force was founded in 2009 to advocate for a memorial
- The successor of this group is the Harlem African Burial Ground Initiative (HABGI), which includes:
 - Rev. Dr. Patricia A. Singletary, Pastor Emerita of Elmendorf Reform Church (co-chair)
 - Melissa Mark-Viverito, former District 8 Councilwoman and City Council Speaker (co-chair)
 - Sharon Wilkins, former Manhattan Deputy Borough Historian and former President of the NY chapter of the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society
 - Melinda Velez, former New York City Council Legislative Assistant for Melissa Mark-Viverito
- EDC has partnered closely with the HABGI on this project since 2015, including to determine a vision for the redevelopment project, guide archaeological work, and co-host community events







Recent Progress




Archaeological Work

- The next step for this project is to complete a new phase of archaeological work in close consultation with the HABG Initiative to determine complete distribution of human remains across the site and recover, protect, analyze, and store them.
- Site management led by Armand who is subcontracting AKRF for archaeology. Same team who conducted the 2015 investigation
- AKRF have included two Black bio-archaeologists with expertise in human remains of African descent, Dr. Rachel Watkins and Dr. Aja M. Lans, on team and secured academic partnership for fieldwork support
- Next Steps

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- Planning: Q1-Q2 2024
- Fieldwork: Q2-Q4 2024
- Lab analysis & reporting: Q4 2024 Q3 2025

Harlem Week Public Announcement

- On August 15th 2023, NYCEDC and the Harlem African Burial Ground Initiative announced:
 - Next phase of archaeology work
 - Introduced the archaeology team
 - Release of Education & Engagement RFP
 - HABGI co-hosted Townhall event
- Took place front of the 126th Bus Depot, in partnership with HABG Initiative
- Attendees included community members, advocacy groups, and local electeds such as CM Ayala, AM Gibbs, BP Levine, Senator Cleare, CM Espaillat





Community Townhall Event

- On September 18th, 2023 NYCEDC hosted a community townhall event in collaboration with the HABGI Initiative
- The event was open to the public, and served as an opportunity for the Harlem community to meet the archaeology team (Armand, AKRF, Dr. Rachel Watkins, Dr. Aja Lans)
- Included a presentation that went through the history of the project and an overview of the scope of upcoming archeology work, followed by a Q&A portion where EDC staff and members of the archeology team answered audience questions





Education & Engagement Scope of Services

- The selected consultant will work with NYCEDC on 18-month education and engagement campaign to deliver high-quality community events and raise awareness at a local and national supporters to restore honor, dignity, and respect to those buried at this sacred site.
- The Education & Engagement Plan will tell the historical, social, and present-day story of the Harlem African Burial Ground through ageappropriate curriculums and programming that engages Harlem students, multimedia content, and a series of public events beginning Summer 2024.


